8*. MOTION – (HON. NGA'NGA', GEORGE MUTHUA, MCA)
(Sectoral Committee on Health Services)

THAT, aware that the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 under Article 26(1) provides that every person has the right to life and Article 43(1)(a) envisages that every person has the right to the highest attainable standard of health, which includes the right to health care services, including reproductive health care; Concerned that there is an upsurge of cases of negligence in public and private dispensaries, health units, pharmacies, chemists health care centers and hospitals which has resulted to untimely loss of lives of innocent patients; Alive to the trueness that there is no policy in place by the County Government to mitigate against the vice; this County Assembly resolves that the County Government establishes a policy that will ensure that all public and private dispensaries, health units, pharmacies, chemists, health care centers and hospitals are registered with the County Government and that the above mentioned health outlets introduces:

- i) A universal automated card which all patients must carry with them and it bears the name of the patient, diagnosis, Medical attention offered, prescribed drugs, name of the health facility, name of the Doctor and/or Nurse, Cost of treatment and health history of the patient.
- ii) A sale receipt that must be issued to all patients indicating name of the outlet, address, prescription given, name and signature of the officer issuing the prescription, date of treatment, cost of treatment and history of the patient where applicable.

Tentative Business for Wednesday (Morning) July 16, 2014

It is notified that the following tentative business will appear in the Order Paper for Wednesday (Morning) July 16, 2014 at 9.00am –

MOTION – HON. ANN KIBEH, NOMINATED MCA

(Sectoral Committee on Health Services)

THAT, aware that the recent Kenya Police statistics on reported rape cases revealed that out of the 882 reported rape cases countrywide, Kiambu County recorded 71 cases being the highest in number thus a 9 per cent increase. Noting that the current national guidelines on medical management of sexual violence by the Ministry of Health was intended to provide comprehensive care to rape survivors pursuant to Section 46 of Sexual Offences Act, 2006. Noting with deep concern that survivors of sexual violence have continued to suffer from miscarriage of justice in their quest to seek legal redress and treatment. Further concerned that when medical examinations are carried out at local hospitals, there has been poor coordination between the hospital, the investigating arm of police and prosecution resulting to the perpetrators roaming freely and leading to increases in repeat offenders. Deeply perturbed that this has been a key deterrent to a majority of sexual violence survivors from reporting such cases. This Assembly therefore urges the County Government to urgently develop a Comprehensive County Post Rape Care Policy Framework to compliment the national government efforts which will include but not limited to;

- i. Establishment of a forensic laboratory within the county to facilitate effective gathering and storage of DNA evidence after a reported rape cases.
- ii. Installation of toll free helpline in all health facilities for purposes of reporting, counseling and equipping it with adequate trained personnel.
- iii. Abolishment of fees charged on the survivors for services rendered.
- iv. Mechanisms on engagement with the national government for establishment of specialized Sexual Offences Unit within the investigating police stations in the county.
- v. Establishment on mechanisms to ensure proper coordination and collaboration amongst law enforcers, hospitals and the community through an all-inclusive programme on sensitization, prevention and management of post rape care.
