(Sectoral Committee on Agriculture Livestock and Fisheries)

THAT, aware that Kiambu County has fertile soil, cool and wet climatic condition which significantly favors crop and livestock due to even annual distribution of rainfall and availability of water, Alive to the fact that Kiambu County is hosting herd of livestock in search of water and pastures and at the same time being used as a conduit by the nomads for unrestrained movement of livestock to different parts of the Country. Bearing in mind that fourth schedule, part 2 of the Constitution of Kenya 2010 provides that Agriculture is a function of the County Government, Deeply concerned that there is no policy in place by the County Government to deal with transhumance, Perturbed that the herders do not possess a livestock movement permit from the veterinary officers for animals seeking pastures within the County, Alive to the trueness that the perpetual unregulated movement of livestock in and out of the County has out stretched existing pastures and water points and a

possible avenue for transmission of livestock related diseases in the County; this County Assembly therefore urges the County Government as a matter of urgency undertake with the national government to review the existing regulations working closely with the key livestock stakeholders and communities and develop a legal framework to regulate free movement of livestock seeking pasture in the County.

I. The Assembly resolved on Thursday, February 6, 2014 as follows:-

THAT, notwithstanding the resolution of the Assembly on Wednesday April 24, 2013 limiting each speech in a debate on any motion, this Assembly resolves that notwithstanding the provisions of the Interim Standing Order 94(4), this Assembly orders that, on Wednesday morning, each speech in a debate **on any Motion**, be limited in the following manner:- A maximum of three hours with not more than twenty (20) minutes for the Mover and five (5) minutes for each other Member speaking, except the Leader of the Majority Party and the Leader of the Minority Party, who shall be limited to a maximum of ten (10) minutes each, and that ten (10) minutes before the expiry of the time, the Mover be called upon to reply; and that priority in speaking be accorded to the Leader of the Majority Party, the Leader of the Minority Party and the Chairperson of the relevant Departmental Committee, in that Order.
